After the parade we went to First United Methodist Church for their lunch of hot dogs, chips and cookies and for our young people to shop their Christmas community giveaway for ornaments, books, a wooden toy and other items contributed by their church members. By a glitch, we didn't all end up at the Children's Nutcracker at the PAC after that but next year we will endeavor to attend that performance together.

We believe the majority of the residents are limited to allotments of \$40/month for their personal spending, and we were glad to help provide them some extras. Avery Walker invited EYC to his fifth birthday party at the parish hall on December 8. How can it be that he is 5 already? Afterwards, EYC gathered at the Presbyterian Church of Henderson for the 99th Alice P. Taylor Candlelight service. Our youth became familiar with this community gathering from volunteering when St. Paul's has hosted it, and it is significant they appreciate it so much they choose to make it part of their Christmas traditions.
