I realized how much I loved my St. Paul's family and Jesus.

On Sunday the Nineteenth of January, we had our annual business meeting at St. Paul's. I was surprised that we only had twenty seven to attend Sunday Service and not everyone stayed for our annual business meeting. It is every member of the Parish's responsibility to attend and participate in the life of our beloved Church. We are at a time when we need everyone's support and commitment for our Church's survival. Is it really to much to ask of you to a least attend one Sunday a month. Think about it that's only one hour of worship for the whole month are you that busy to attend one worship service. I know we have parishioners who are unable to attend, especially our older folks. Thanks be to God, they at least watch us on Facebook when they are able.

The truth is nowhere in the Bible does it tell us we need to go to Church. However what the word of God does say is we are to gather with like minded people. It's not that we need a Church building, but we need to associate with other believers. By gathering with other believers, we not only follow the biblical call to be part of the body of Christ, but we also open ourselves to the blessings and healing of our Lord Jesus Christ.

I believe it to be dangerous to not take God's word seriously. We should all put God first in our lives and attend Church on Sundays. Our culture has gradually diminished the importance of rest and religious activity to the point that it is now rare to find people who try to be at Church consistently throughout the year. I, Deacon Larry, say all this with love in my heart for my St. Paul's family.

Finally, I want to inform those who didn't attend the annual meeting, I will be retiring this year. I have already spoken with the Bishop expressing my wish to retire the last Sunday in July. I have already exceeded the regular retirement age of seventy two, this year I will be seventy four. I feel it is time for me to retire and enjoy the time I have left on God's good earth. May God's mercy and blessing be with us all.

Thanks to the Purdys and to Javon for staying after to dismantle the trees, wreaths, standards, garland, nativities and other Christmas decorations and to prepare them with care to be stored for next year and also for hauling the boxes back upstairs. We had planned to follow that act of service by attending the Martin Luther King, Jr. community service at First Missionary Baptist Church but it was cancelled due to the lingering impact of the winter storm.
